Spotlight: readme files

Use case 1: you need to access data and code that you last worked on 5 years ago. Are you sure that you still remember how, when and where you obtained the data? Who your collaborators were? Which files represent the final version? Wouldn't it be better to leave your later self a note?

Use case 2: you download a published data set for your research. The ZIP archive contains 200 data files in five different formats. Wouldn't it be helpful if the ZIP archive would also contain a document describing the different data files, the conditions for re-use, and how to cite the data?

In both cases a **readme file** is the solution. A **readme file** provides information about a data file and is intended to help ensure that the data can be correctly interpreted, by yourself at a later date or by others when sharing or publishing data. Store it in the top level directory of the data set (or code) that it describes.
