Spotlight

Data Storage and Backup

Prevent disasters this winter – securely store and back up your data regularly. We recommend using an automated service to schedule regular backups. Cornell offers <u>CrashPlan</u> and <u>Cohesity server backup</u> as options for departments and staff. Personal computers often come equipped with backup software, such as Backup for Windows and Time Machine for Macs. Here are some more hot tips to prevent the cold winds of a data disaster from blowing this winter:

- keep at least three copies of your data (hear, near, and far)
- don't create your backup right on your local hard drive
- Synchronization with a cloud storage service is not the same as creating a backup
- Use the **Data Storage Finder tool** to find more storage options supported by Cornell
- Learn more about <u>data storage and backup strategies</u> (like why shouldn't you use a memory stick to back up your most precious research?)

Harvard Law School Library Innovation Lab launches search of Data.gov archive

The Library Innovation Lab <u>announced its archive</u> of the federal data clearinghouse <u>Data.gov</u> earlier this year, and now has launched <u>Data.gov</u> Archive <u>Search</u>, an interface for exploring this important collection of government datasets. This new search interface enables discovery of more than 311,000 datasets comprising some 17.9 terabytes of data on topics ranging from <u>automotive</u> recalls to <u>chronic disease indicators</u>.

Weill Cornell Medicine and CCSS have received a \$5.1M, three-year grant from the National Institutes of Health's Autism Data Science Initiative (ADSI) to launch the Autism Replication, Validation, and Reproducibility (AR²) Center. Principal investigator Judy Zhong, Weill Cornell Medicine, and Co-PI Peter Enns, Robert H. Harrison Director of CCSS, will leverage the advanced computing and replication resources of CCSS to replicate ADSI project results. – Cornell Chronicle

This <u>guide</u> incorporates the <u>new National Institutes of Health Public Access Policy</u> which requires NIH-funded Author Accepted Manuscripts accepted for publication in a journal to be deposited in PubMed Central with no embargo.
